- Website up June 1999 – averaged 83,500 visitors throughout 2008
- Sponsored two national meetings – “Evidence-based Complementary and Alternative Cancer Therapies” 2008 and 2009
- 3rd Annual meeting scheduled for January 7-9, 2010
- Funded advocate volunteers to summarize more than 120 meetings
- Donated support funds to African breast cancer organizations
